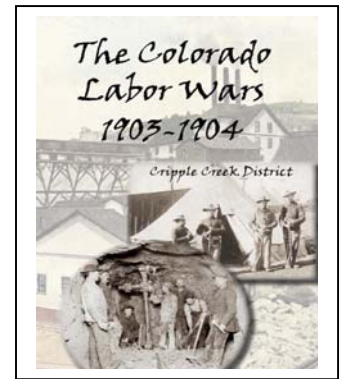

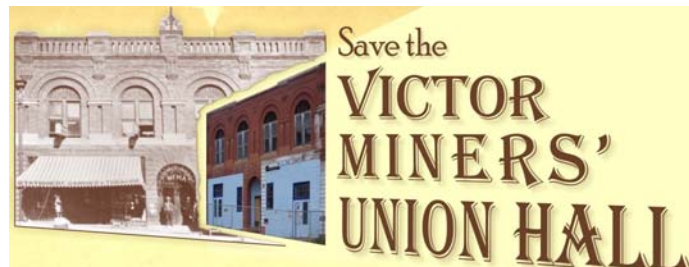
Kathy Sturdevant is Professor of History at Pikes Peak Community College.
