Rock Climbing

More Area Hiking Trails

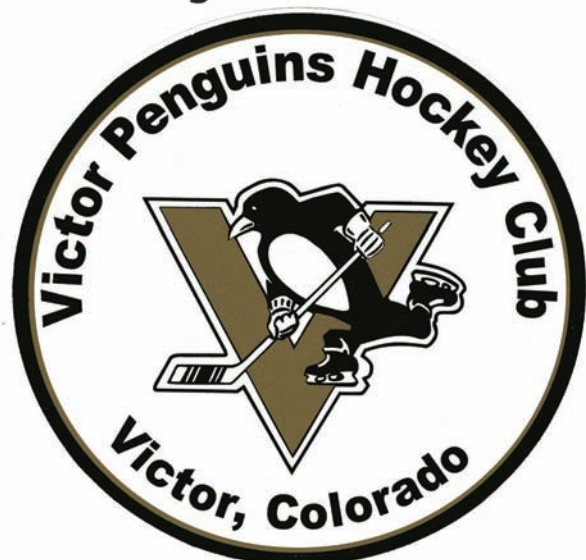
Horsethief Park - Highway 67 at the Midland Terminal Railroad Tunnel; the trail winds up to a mountain park area.

BRING WARM CLOTHES

Southern Teller County is nearly 2 miles above sea level. If you are from a lower elevation, you may experience shortness of breath or other discomforts when exercising. The high elevation affects breathing and heart rate and will also affect how much alcohol you may consume. Please drink responsibly.

Weather is unpredictable. Nights can drop into the 30s even in summer, making this a great place to escape from the heat. While the summer is filled with sunny warm days in the 70s, it can also be rainy and even snow. Bring a warm jacket and clothing to ensure your stay is comfortable. In the winter, enjoy sunny blue-sky days. Often when it's snowing in Colorado Springs and Ute Pass, Southern Teller County is basking in sunshine. Take extra precautions when driving in the mountains. Pack warm clothes, emergency food, a blanket and chains.
